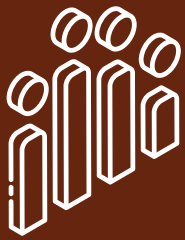

We had more residents join the Monday morning exercises this month. Sixteen (16) participants walked, jogged, and danced with us to promote the weight loss program. We encouraged more residents to do our exercises inside when winter approached.

We proposed bullying awareness activities at the family and senior sites. We hosted the awareness rally at both properties and created an arts & crafts event of self-portrait regarding bully awareness in the family community. Twenty-nine (29) residents participated in Renaissance Square's rally, and eighteen (18) seniors came for the party at the senior site.



We hosted four arts and crafts events, two for each Renaissance Square family property and Senior Residence. Thirteen (13) participants came to enjoy the self-portrait event, and twenty-two (22) children and adults joined in decorating the cupcakes with fun. Twelve (12) residents at the senior site participated in the painting event, and twenty-six (26) enjoyed their tie-dye activity with AmeriLife.



We especially wanted to thank Walmart Pharmacy. Walmart sponsored the health clinic to provide flu, pneumonia, shingles, and Covid 19 vaccines to the seniors on October 15th. Nine (9) residents got the vaccination they need it.

The residents enjoyed the food, the music, the conversations, and especially the face paintings at Merritt for kids.



We hosted two arts and crafts events at Newsome. The Schooling Encouragement Foundation supplied travel bags for three (3) seniors to decorate, and AmeriLife provided the T-Shirts for the tie-dye activity. Fifteen (15) residents enjoyed the tie-dye event.



AmeriLife sponsored and hosted the birthday lunch with seniors on the 31st. Thirteen (13) participants gathered together for lunch and birthday activities. Seniors sent several thank you notes to the Emana team and SEF volunteers to express their appreciation for all the teams have done in the community.



Thank the Carleton Companies for making the computer lab ready. SEF volunteer was able to conduct the first computer training for seniors. One (1) senior received an hour of exercise on effectively using a Windows operating system computer.

Thirty-seven (37) residents came to the food pantry hosted on the 20th. Thanks to Tarrant foodbank and the manager for supplying some food boxes from the Pioneer Place community, enabling SEF and Emana to add more products to the events at Newsome Homes and Merritt McGowan. The residents loved the milk, cheese, and beef cans.

At Merritt McGowan, SEF volunteers conducted the scholastic tutoring activities, a computer lab for youth program, and the "trunk or treat" event this month. Fifty-nine (59) children participated in the computer program for youth after school. After the computer session, they enjoyed snacks and drinks sponsored by SEF.

Thirty (27) kids came to the educational event on the 17th. Three (3) took advantage of the tutoring program to prepare for their homework assignments. Children need an interactive and creative program to advance their schooling interests. Thanks, SEF, for making it happen.

Due to the rain, we postponed the trunk-or-treat event to the 31st, and it came out enjoyably. Seventy-six (76) children and adults joined us at the event. We presented a spooky trunk and delivered a lovely sweetness to the participants.

We increased the number of participants in the food pantry event at Merritt. Forty-seven (47) residents received the needed food. Especially, children loved the cheese, milk, and cereals we supplied.



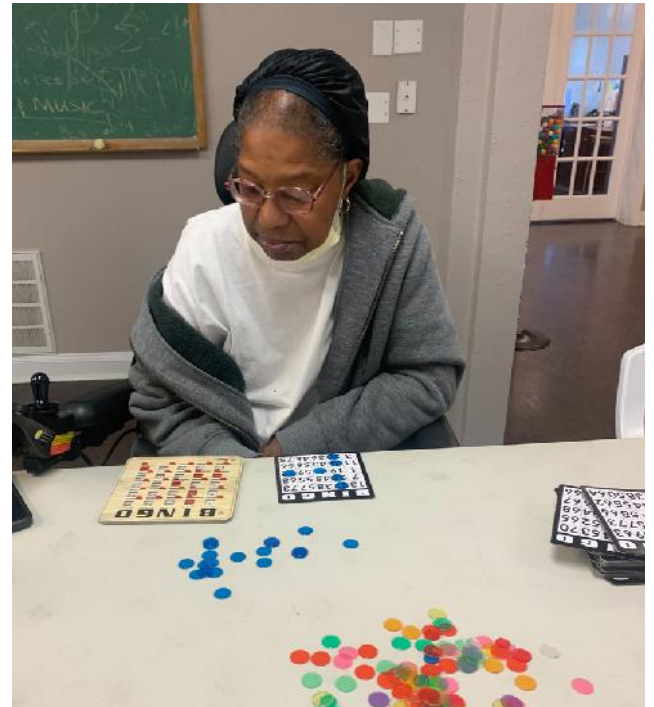
**Newsome Homes

The after-school free meal program by Prolific Seeds serves thirty (30) children daily from Monday to Friday after-school hours.

The management team collaborated on a National Night Out event, and Emana invited its business partners to participate. They hosted a successful event, and Emana also provided a fun painting activity. Forty-five (45) children and adults came out to join the event.

Thanks to United Healthcare for continuing to host the monthly bingo at Ridge and Schooling Encouragement Foundation for sponsoring the trunk-or-treat event at Ridge at Trinity. Eight (8) residents enjoyed the bingo game, and seventy-one (71) residents participated in the spooky trick and treat.

With assistance from the property manager and resident volunteers, we opened the food pantry room on the 2nd floor two times a month to help residents in need. A total of forty-four (44) residents participated in the month of October in those events. On the second Monday of the month, Tarrant Foodbank delivers senior food boxes, and Emana and its volunteers help to distribute them to the residents. Forty (40) residents joined the event and received food boxes.



We hosted two social events, a bullying awareness rally on the 12th and the Halloween costume party on the 29th. Twenty-six (26) seniors joined the rally, and thirteen (13) residents came to the costume party to enjoy food, music, and chatting.



Seven (7) seniors participated in the rock painting activity. Sixteen (16) residents joined the tie-dye event. Thanks to Schooling Encouragement Foundation for the material sponsoring the painting event and AmeriLife for supplying the T-shirts for the dye activity.

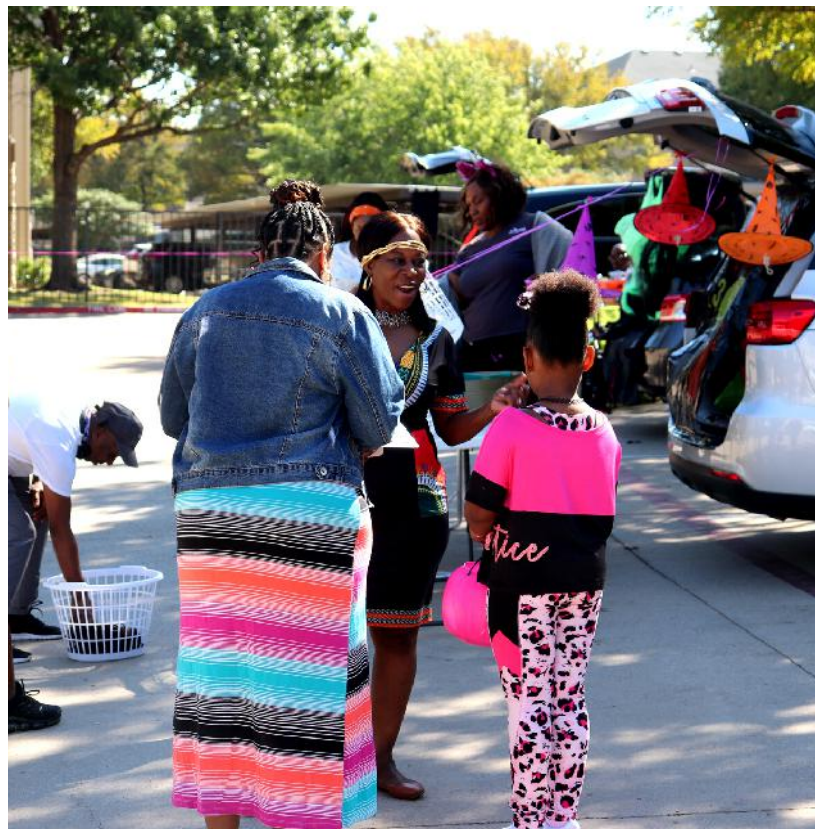
